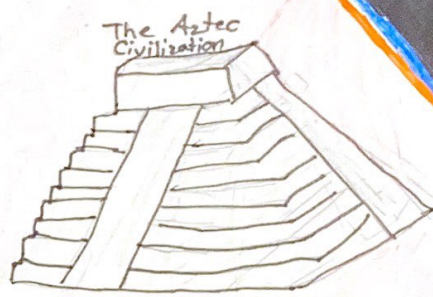




# HOPIS

- made stew with chili peppers, corn and beans

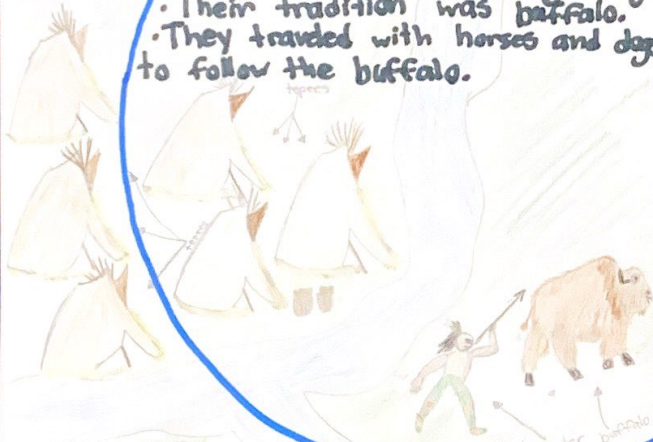
- lived in Middle America
