

# WOTTDER Discussion/Writing Prompt Cards

Here are 97 open-ended question cards to enhance your reading of the amazing novel, *Wonder* by R.J. Palacio. There are three types of cards included:

- Cards I-58 are meant to be used while reading the book. The cards are correlated with specific parts (narrators) which are noted at the bottom of each card.
- Cards 59-75 focus on characters, themes, and other elements that run through the whole book.
   These are best used after you have read the entire book.
- The final 12 cards are Mr. Browne's Precepts (10 months plus Summer and Auggie's precepts)

Because these cards are meant for discussion or as writing prompts, they are not simple comprehension questions. Rather, they require students to explain, infer, analyze and evaluate. Many of these cards require students to support their answers with evidence from the text. Others ask students to form an opinion about a character or event. A few ask students to put themselves in a character's shoes or to reflect on their own feelings.


The precept cards are also great for discussion. Or you could follow Mr. Browne's lead and discuss one each month and then have your students write an essay about what the precept means to them.


#### Printing and Cutting:

These cards were made to be printed in color, but will print out fine in gray scale too. They should print out with even margins around the cards; however, because every printer is different, it is possible that you may need to adjust your printer settings. Selecting "actual size" or adjusting the size percentage should do the trick. Cut the cards apart using the dotted guidelines (discarding the bottom strip). Laminate if possible. Another option is to print on cardstock.
